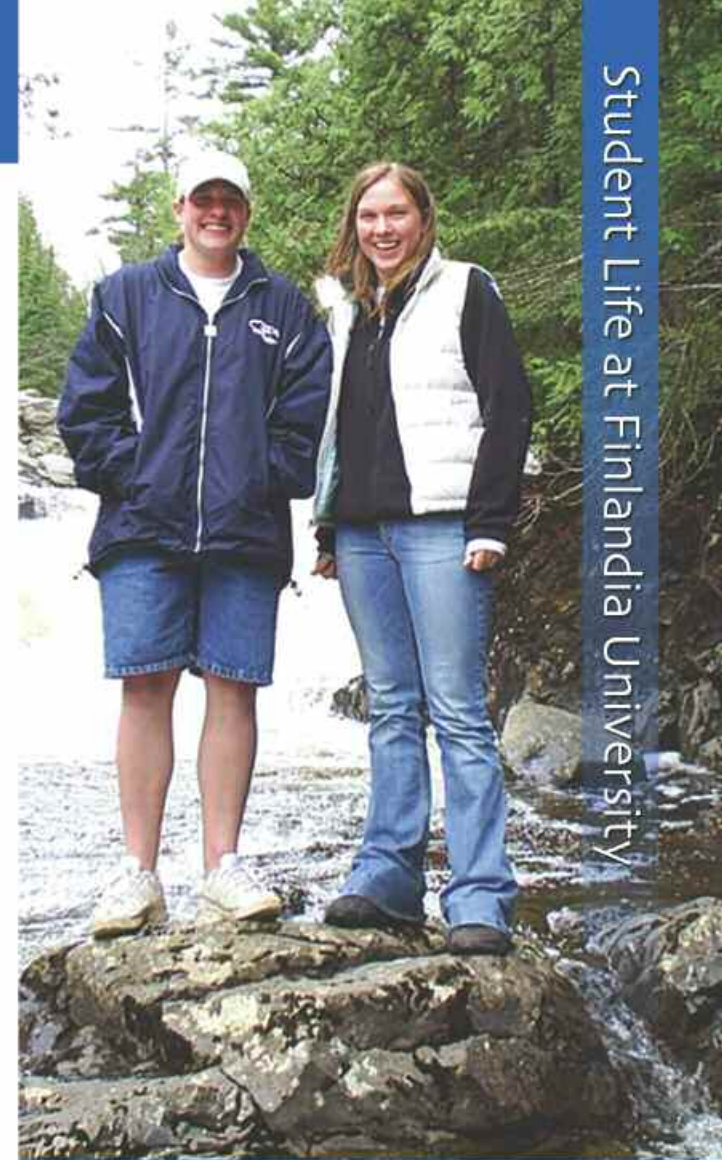

Finlandia's learning community makes an impact beyond the classroom. Campus projects, social activities, and community partnerships bring to life our mission of service.

Student service opportunities support MDOT Adopt-A-Highway, Copper Country Humane Society, Little Brothers Friends of the Elderly, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Habitat for Humanity, and others.

Extracurricular service-related activities include Campus Ministry and an annual "alternate" spring break. Many university courses also emphasize service, including UNS 100, Finlandia Success Seminar; REL 230, Servant Leadership; and REL/SOC 236, Service Learning in Tanzania.
