4. How many men and how many women were part of the first graduating class at Suomi College?
5. What world famous architect designed the Nikander Hall on the Campus of Finlandia University?
6. The first Finnish American newspaper consisted of how many editions before the paper folded?
7. Which long-serving president of Finland visited the Copper Country in 1976?
8. What was the fate of clergyman Jooseppi Riippa, who is known for his famous composition “Kotimaani ompi Suomi”?
9. How much did the founders of the Farmers’ Co-operative Trading Company invest to start their store in 1914?
