



The Ponsse Einari Vidgrén Foundation Internship

Ponsse and Finlandia University are pleased to announce an internship position for a Finlandia University student at Ponsse North America in Rhinelander, Wisconsin (approximately two weeks) and Ponsse Plc headquarters in Vieremä, Finland (approximately three weeks). The length at each site may vary based on the requirements of the organization. The position will tentatively begin the week of May 8, 2017. A description of the learning objectives and program outline are as follows:

1) Learning objectives

The internship aims at the following outcomes

- Through learning about Ponsse the student will have a general understanding of how this type of a company is built and how it operates.
- By becoming familiar with various functions in the organization, the student is better able to vision and plan his/her career path
- Through project work and assigned tasks the student will have practical work experience
- The whole period provides the student an opportunity to develop intercultural communication skills and adaptability to an international working environment

1. Ponsse North America, Rhinelander, WI

1-2 weeks

- **The student will learn about Ponsse North America, it's values, operations and the general forest industry that the company operates in.**
- **Learn through interaction with management and personnel, employee "shadowing," visiting customers and logging sites.**
- **The student would work on one main project and some smaller tasks**
- **Smaller tasks may include assisting in event planning and organization, information sourcing, office tasks etc.**

2. Ponsse Plc, Vieremä, Finland

3-4 weeks

- **Face-to-face interactive introduction sessions given by Ponsse experts and visitations to the main operational units**
- **The student would work on one main project and some smaller tasks**
- **Smaller tasks may include assisting in event planning and organization, information sourcing, office tasks etc.**

The internship will include accommodation while at Ponsse North America in Rhinelander, plus accommodation and 2 daily meals while at Ponsse Plc in Vieremä, Finland. In addition, the student will receive a \$2500 stipend from the Einari Vidgrén Foundation to assist with travel and living expenses.

The ideal candidate will be a junior or senior majoring in international business, marketing, management, or accounting. Qualified candidates in other majors will also be given consideration. The ideal candidate will have excellent academic credentials, demonstrated leadership ability, and the ability to handle the responsibilities of the internship in a professional manner. Finally, the intern will need to be able to work and live in a cross-cultural environment.
